

Micro-Church Tool 11 STATEMENT OF FAITH WORKSHEET

The Statement of Faith acts as the guiding principles that dictate behavior and actions of the micro-church and its mission. These truths are adopted by all members as the guiding beliefs of the micro-church. All actions undertaken by the church are filtered through these Bible-based truths.

Establishing these beliefs as early in the process a possible will help to unify the understanding of micro-church members and provide a solid foundation on which they can stand in faith.

ACCEPTING BY FAITH

There are certain beliefs that need to be accepted by faith. These are the foundational concepts upon which Christianity is built. Unfortunately, doctrines, religion, and religious traditions have placed a cloud over many of these truths. Foundational truths as well as other biblical truths need to be fully supported by the Word of God.

The foundational beliefs that are presented below are a good starting point for the belief defining process that is about to be undertaken. Use the scriptures cited as a starting point for verification of these beliefs. For each belief, list the truths discovered in the scriptures that support the belief. Make sure that these beliefs can be accepted as absolute truth by all members of the micro-church.

COMMON MISBELIEFS

Another way to vet beliefs is to examine areas where common misbeliefs have been established. For each misbelief, there is generally an opposite belief that can be established. Use this list to help church members to identify other deep-seated beliefs that must be abandoned.

VETTING PROCESS SUGGESTIONS

The following are a few suggestions to help the micro-church members process a belief for inclusion in the Statement of Faith:

- Fully identify each belief before starting the vetting process.
- Perform a search for the key words that identify the belief using a concordance or other tools.
- Identify related Bible verses that can be examined to arrive at conclusions concerning the belief.
- Perform an internet search to identify approaches that other have taken. (Be cautious of what is taken as fact from the internet)
- Seek spiritual guidance through the Holy Spirit through prayer and Bible study.
- Examine the Hebrew and Greek meaning of key words that will form the belief.

BELIEF SUBJECTS

The subjects used for the Statement of Faith will vary from micro-church to micro-church. Each church is unique and their focus will be reflected in the statement. Use the following categories to help jumpstart the creative process. Insert additional subjects that come to mind while proceeding through this process.

Writing the Statement

Start the writing process by injecting God into the proceedings through prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide the direction of the micro-church as this important document is created. Keep the conversation open throughout the process for best results.

Many churches start with a preamble that describes the commitment to uphold the Statement of Faith such as: "We affirm that these truths come from God and are documented in the Bible. These beliefs are the foundation of our church and mission. We commit to upholding them in all areas of our lives."

Each belief should be documented using the scriptures that established them. List the main supporting verses after each belief that is included in the statement. Keep a journal with notes on how each truth was established and all of the background information and supporting scriptures. Document the thought process so there is no doubt as to how the belief was arrived. The journal should also include any changes that are made to the statement over time.

Basic writing tips for the Statement of Faith include:

- Be clear
- Be concise
- · Carefully select each word
- Make it understandable to everyone

Each belief in the Statement of Faith typically starts with the words "We believe". The key is keeping it simple and easy to understand. Defining as many truths or beliefs as possible will help church members to have a clear understanding on which they can stand confidently in Christ.

A detailed evaluation of a belief should still be undertaken if the belief is being adopted from another source. The church needs to be able to make the belief its own. Verifying each truth is an important part of the process.

The following are beliefs that others have used in their Statement of Faith to use as examples. Select those beliefs that may be useful for vetting and adding to your statement.

	We believe that God is the creator and sustainer of all things.			
	We believe that all things on earth exist for the glory of God.			
	We believe that God has provided everything we have and that we are stewards of His resources.			
	We believe that salvation is a free gift from God.			
	We believe that the Holy Spirit lives in all Christians who have accepted salvation through Christ.			
	We believe that everyone has sinned and come short of the glory of God.			
	We believe that by God's grace our sins past, present and future have been forgiven.			
	We believe that God has given all Christians the power to heal the sick.			
	We believe the purpose of our church is to disciple through our mission of serving the less fortunate.
